"CALABASH ELKS DONATE TO WOUNDED WARRIOR BATTALION & FISHER HOUSE"

"Gift Cards for Both Regional Wounded Soldiers and Support for Their Families"

In dual presentations, the Veteran's Affairs Committee (VAC) of Elks Lodge 2679 in Calabash, NC, recently donated \$500.00 each in Wal-Mart Gift Cards to Both the U.S. Army's Warriors in Transition Battalion (WTB) located at Fort Bragg in Fayetteville, NC, and the "Fisher House," also located on Fort Bragg.

The Gift Cards are especially valuable to the Wounded Warrior Transition Battalion at Ft. Bragg's Womack Army Medical Center, and the "Fisher House," because they allow the Battalion Headquarters to purchase necessities such as Incidentals, Clothing, Snacks, and some other Operational Items for the recovering Soldiers and their unit which are not funded through normal appropriations, and would otherwise not be able to be obtained. The same goes for the "Fisher House," – they are able to purchase what they need when they need it.

The focus of the WTB at Fort Bragg is to provide all Warriors in Transition as wounded, ill, and injured Soldiers, and their families, the best possible care from reception through disposition, whether they return to duty or separate from Service. A "Fisher House" is "a home away from home" for families of patients receiving medical care at Major Military and Veteran's Administration (VA) Medical Centers, in this case, Fort Bragg. The homes are normally located within walking distance of the treatment facility or have transportation available. There are 70 Fisher Houses located on 24 military installations and 27 VA Medical Centers. Many more houses are under construction or in design.
