Key changes to ER of the Year

- This just asks if the lodge "applied" for grants. Not if they were awarded. This awards for effort.
- This gives the opportunity for any member of a lodge to nominate their ER. It doesn't have to be the ER him/her self. In some instances perhaps a lodge will want it to be a surprise.
- It still requires the Secretary to verify.
- We still need the final report to be attached. This gives us data on membership gain as well as ENF donations in the event we need a tie breaker.
- This will also be on-line and can be completed either hard copy or electronic.
- Deadline is April 1, 2019

The Military Appreciation awards – the pinnacle of day 1 of the festival, this allows the Goldsboro Elks an opportunity to provide community recognition for top achievers from SJAFB.

Kinston Veterans Home visit – the DownEast Rolling Thunder motorcycle rally begins with a formal ceremony at Veterans Memorial Park, Goldsboro, NC. The ceremony includes a laying of a wreath at the memorial followed by a police escort for a large group of motorcyclists as they travel 30 miles to the Kinston Veterans Home where they spend the day visiting with the Veterans that call that facility home. This day of fellowship with our Heroes is always a moving experience.

The Wings of Wayne Military Appreciation Festival is led by Doug McGrath, Exalted Ruler, and a committed team of volunteers. The donation, made possible by a Gratitude Grant to Gastonia Lodge from the Elks National Foundation, will help fund the Bessemer City Middle School summer enrichment program. The Summer Enrichment Program targets first generation college students, and in some cases, first generation high school graduates. The program works with two groups of 30 students, with each group participating in a three day program. The first day of the program has a campus tour of Gardner Webb University with lunch in the dining hall and hands on activities led by university instructors. On the sec-

ond day the students visit Crowder's Mountain State Park where they learn about overcoming obstacles through experiences such as fishing and hiking the mountain in hopes they can apply lessons learned to their daily lives. The last day is a career day when students meet with a local business owner, receive mentoring, have lunch, as well as visit other local businesses to learn about career options, preparing for careers, and decision making skills to keep them focused on their goals. The students also learn to write resumes and practice appropriate interview skills through role playing.

Hickory Elks Honor WWII Vet During Flag Day Ceremony



Hickory NC Elks Lodge 1654 conducted the 2018 Flag Day observance and ceremony on Wednesday, June 14th. This is an annual tradition observed by Elks Lodges across the U.S. and its territories. The Grand Lodge designated June 14 as Flag Day in 1907, making it a mandatory observance for all Lodges in 1911. President Truman, an Elk himself, recognized June 14 as a national observance of the flag. Since then all Americans honor the flag on this day.

Replete with the 13 Folds Ritual, a most impressive ceremony describing the meaning of and honoring our nation's flag with an inspiring rendition of America the Beautiful by Lodge Brother Ulysses Long. During the ceremony Hickory Elks honored Staff Sergeant Arthur

Huffman, US Army, a 97 year old veteran of World War II, as the 2018 Hickory Elks Patriot of the Year. Following WWII and his return to Hickory, SSGT Huffman worked in the furniture industry for 38 years retiring from North Hickory Furniture in 1996. He is the eldest member of the American Legion, Post 48. To commemorate the Patriot recognition, a name plate honoring SSGT Huffman will be affixed to the Lodge's Patriots Pole along with 8 other local Patriots recognized since the re-dedication of the Lodge flagpole 9 years ago.
