MEMBERSHIP

A Message from Kevin Black, Membership Chairman

At the Grand Lodge Convention, it became official: The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks had its first national membership gain since 1980. The Elks membership grew by 94 members last year. A growth of 94 is not huge but it put an end to almost of 40 years of losing membership. North Carolina was able to contribute to this gain with its own membership gain of 43, stopping a string of 14 years of membership loss. Now that the tide has turned, it is even more important to maintain momentum and not slide back under our watch this year. We do not want to be part of the leadership that halts the growth.

The Grand Lodge has provided a new campaign — **When Elkdom Shines, Elkdom Grows.** When Elks accomplish great things in their community, people recognize us, and want to be a part of us. Lodge activities and functions allow guests to see our Lodge at its best and that is the chance to convert guests to potential members. We were all guests at one time, and someone extended the opportunity to join and got an application in our hand. To help Lodges maintain a focus on Membership, the Grand Lodge has provide some new online tools to provide ideas and draw potential members.

There is an online Membership Guide: https://virtualmanuals.elks.org/membership-guide/

This site provides a process to take guests all the way through orientation. The site is full of many ways to enhance a Lodge website with Membership content and ideas to help membership grow. There is also a focus on orientation. It even includes an online membership invite and application.

There is an online Marketing Guide: https://virtualmanuals.elks.org/marketing-guide/

This site is loaded with ways to promote your Lodge and gain more eyes on it, through efforts that focus on Bricks and Clicks. Bricks provides ways to get people in your door and Clicks shows ways to draw more hits and views on your website and social media content.

Another item I want to point out from the GL Convention is a renewed focus on the Ritual. Not in trying to get officers to memorize but to emphasize to Lodges to perform the Ritual properly and with the respect it deserves. The Ritual is the new member's first chance to see the Lodge Officers together as a team and telling the story of who we are and what we do as Elks. This initial impact is forever lasting in the minds of these new members and has a long term impact on whether those members may get involved. Encourage Lodges to practice and be prepared for the Ritual, it can strengthen the Lodge officers and increases teamwork within the group.

Current membership numbers show that we have brought in 407 new members so far this year. The State has currently lost 83 members to date, but the bigger issue as always is delinquencies. Currently we have 1,253 members that are delinquent. That is over 13% of total membership, we encourage ER's to make efforts to bring those members back in and get membership committees to find ways to reduce these numbers. It is truly a total Lodge effort in making membership grow, from getting new members, and encouraging existing members to pay those dues.

Bottom line on all this information: The Elks are in the people business and without people, we have no revenue and we are unable to accomplish our charitable works.


Memorial Day Celebration at the Fayetteville Veterans Home




