GUIDELINES for the THAD EURE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

1. General The award is given to an Elk who has truly distinguished themselves in promoting the principles and programs of Elkdom. The candidate should also have a history of service to their community, state and country.

The Thad Eure Distinguished Service Award Committee will be composed of the sitting Board of Trustees and the State President of the North Carolina State Elks Association Inc.

- 2. Personal Biography
- 3. Community Involvement
- 4. Service beyond the Community
- 5. Elks Service Biography
- 6. Other Distinguishing Accomplishments
- 7. Notes (1) It is not mandatory that all the sections above be completed; however all information submitted will be considered in the selection of the most qualified candidate. (2) All resumes will be held for three years from the time of submission unless the candidate is selected before that time expires. All resumes may be updated each year if additional information is pertinent. (3) It is not mandatory that the award be given each year, regardless of the number of resumes on file.
- 8. Submission The nomination of the candidate should be approved by the home lodge of the nominee prior to submission of the resume to the Board of Trustees for consideration. The resume should be sent to the North Carolina State Elks Association Trustee from the same district as the nominee. This should be sent prior to February 15th of the year that the resume is initially submitted.

Past State President Edwin Roberson

Edwin Lewis Roberson, Sr., 89, of Richfield, NC passed away Tuesday, October 22, 2019 at the Mountain Home Veteran Administration Hospital in Johnson City, TN.

He was born September 15, 1930 in Jones County, NC to the late George Lewis Roberson and Ada Moore Roberson. Ed was a veteran of the U.S. Air Force where he retired after 22 years of service. He was a lifetime member of the Elks, a Mason, a Shriner, and a member of the American Legion.

Ed joined the Salisbury Lodge where he went through the chairs to become Exalted Ruler. Later he demitted to the High Point Lodge where he was an active member. Ed served the North Carolina State Elks Association as Vice President of the West Central District in 1990-1991, and as District Deputy in 1992-1993. Two years later he was elected as State President for the 1995-1996 year. Ed served on many State Association committees and was very active with ritual serving as a ritual judge.

Ed Roberson was preceded in death by his wife of 65 years, Dorothy M. Roberson. Surviving is his wife, Brownell Allman of Newland, NC.

At the 2019 Elks National Convention in St. Louis, outgoing Grand Exalted Ruler Mike Luhr issued a challenge to the Elks members to raise funds for the Pearl Harbor National Memorial in Hawaii. During their travels throughout the country, Barbara and Mike Luhr visited the Pearl Harbor National Memorial in Hawaii, in awe of the veterans who were aboard the USS Arizona that fateful day. And yet some of the displays and signage at the memorial were not as expected. They were old, weather-beaten and outdated.

They wondered if the Elks could play a part in helping to improve this memorial. That idea soon became reality, and the Elks are now partnering with the Pacific Historical Parks, a WWII focused 501(c)(3) tax-exempt public benefit organization that oversees the Pearl Harbor National Memorial.

With contributions from Elks across the country, we can preserve, restore and modernize the USS Arizona Memorial.

All funds raised will be used to:

- Replace old, faded and peeling outdoor exhibits along Pearl Harbor National Memorial's perimeter.
- Upgrade current static displays with digital exhibits, build new interactive displays to engage children, and modernize the Pearl Harbor museums with iPads and touch screens.
- Fabricate and install new exhibits, displays, programs, and software to better educate and serve all museum visitors.
- Our ultimate goal is to raise \$783,000, or a dollar per member, to truly help preserve history, perpetuate peace and reconciliation and ensure that the memories of our veterans, passed and living, are never forgotten.

These contributions will help honor the service and dedication of Americans whose profound contributions to our nation should never be forgotten, so that generations to come will know and appreciate the enormous sacrifices of the Greatest Generation.

Morehead-Beaufort Lodge Holds "Warm Welcome to the Library"


